NO	ACTION POINT	DISCUSSION POINTS
1.	Opening	Welcomed by the Secretary Khushwant Singh with an emphasis for all to abide to the RMC0 SOPs
2.	Jathedar's Address	<p>Jathedar Ji opened his address by assuring the members that the Annual Report will be discussed at which point everyone will have the opportunity to seek clarification on matters within the report.</p> <p>Many activities had been planned and carried out over the last 4 years, however, the EXCO had collectively agreed that publicity of these events would not be the focus, instead the focus should be on what "Sewa" was available to the members and what resources were needed to run these activities.</p> <p>Flagship programmes i.e Hola Mahalla / Punjabi Bhasha / Annual Samelan were continued together with the grand programme held in conjunction with the 550 Saal of Guru Nanak Dev Ji's Parkash Purbh which were all well organised.</p> <p>The SNSM took on an active role in assisting the government during the MCO period by working together with a few Gurdwaras and Sikh Organisations to cook and deliver langgar to locked down areas. On a daily basis, approximately 100,000 with 20,000 dry rations were delivered all over the country.</p> <p>SNSM women's wing "enKaurage" organised a camp @ Khalsa Land to bring together young Sikh women between the ages of 13 to 22 to provide them with a platform to discuss various issues that they face and may not know who they can turn to for assistance. He added that in the pipeline was for a camp of the similar nature be organised for the boys as well.</p> <p>He informed the house that as mandated by the house at the last AGM, the EXCO on 16 September 2020, had received an offer for the purchase of the SNSM House in Titiwangsa. The offer received was for RM5.6Mil. However, as the offer was received so close to the AGM. The EXCO has decided to allow the House to approve and accept the sale.</p> <p>Jathedar Ji informed the House that. The ROS, acting on a complaint lodged by a member, had come to SNSM House to conduct an audit on our KPIs. The complaint received by them stated that a request to call for an EGM to remove the current leadership had been submitted, however no EGM was called by the EXCO as the proposer had withdrawn his proposal. By the grace of Waheguru Ji, the audit went well and they informed that all our affairs were in order. The only 2 points brought up were:</p>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Why our AGM had been held in July when the constitution states June ii. Suggestion that the SNSM logo should have SNSM added to the logo to avoid confusion as they note that many Gurdwaras & Sikh organisations have emulated the same logo. <p>Jathedar Ji ended his address by thanking all Gurdwaras, societies and individuals for their cooperation and apologised if he had unintentionally offended anyone.</p>
3.	Confirmation of Last AGM Minutes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Sdr. Gurdeep Singh #1188 questioned what steps had been taken on his proposal raised at the last AGM that Satsangs hosted by the youth should be revived at all Gurdwaras. <p>Secretary Khushwant Singh informed that all activities, including satsangs were imbedded in the SNSM activity report in the Annual Report.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ii. Sdr. Harnarinder Singh #0408 proposed that in consideration of time, all future Annual Reports & Minutes should have an "Action Taken" column added iii. Sdr. Sukhinderpal Singh #1801 queried why there was no update on action taken on the issue of alcoholism & drugs within the Sikh community raised by him at the last AGM <p>Secretary Khushwant Singh updated the house that both these topics together with other such natured issues were addressed by professionals during both the Annual Samelan and the enKaurage camp</p> <p>Minutes Confirmed Proposer: Sdr. Gurdeep Singh #1188 Secunder: Sdr. Amarjit Singh #1458</p>
6.	Confirmation of Annual Report	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Sdr. Sukhinderpal Singh #1801 raised that there has been some push back by some factions of the Sanggat that the topic of hair "kesh" should not be brought up or discussed during parchar as some individuals tend to get sensitive about the topic. He stressed that the SNSM should ensure that this does not happen as it is a very important point and we as Sikhs should acknowledge and recognise with pride those who have maintained this "roop" – regardless of age. <p>Annual Report Confirmed Propose: Sdr. Sukhinderpal Singh #1801 Secunder: Sdr. Jeswant Singh #1530</p>
7.	Confirmation of Audited Accts	<p>Clarifications by the Treasurer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Payments made for Khalsa Land development had increased in comparison to the previous year due to the completion of the construction of the TNB structures ii. For 2020 the utilisation of monies from the "Donation" funds has increased due to the high amounts that were utilised under the Global Sikhs umbrella for "Sewa" carried out during the MCO and also as donation sent to India during the floods

		<p>iii. A discussion on the matter of whether the Khalsa Land Development funds should be maintained in a Fixed Deposit or be invested into Unit Trusts resulted in a decision that the Land Committee should get professional financial advice and move forward in the best interest of the project.</p> <p>Audited Accounts Confirmed Proposer: Sdr. Jagdave Singh #2431 Secunder: Sdr. Harnarinder Singh #0408</p>
8.	Resolutions	<p>1. Resolutions raised by the Secretary and supported by the Jathedar: Subject of Resolution: a) <u>Number of Members appointed to Central Committee; and</u> b) <u>Amendment of Emblem</u></p> <p>Intent of Resolution: <u>To enable easier and more practical compliance with constitutional requirements and to differentiate the Emblem of Pertubuhan Sikh Naujawan SNSM Malaysia ("SNSM") from other similar community and society emblems.</u></p> <p>Sdr Khushwant Singh (#3241) as the Proposer explained the rationale behind both the proposed changes to the SNSM Constitution. He explained that the proposed changes were suggested upon feedback received from the ROS on their on-site audit on 3 September 2020.</p> <p>Full details of the proposed changes were made available to members as part of the AGM pack.</p> <p>Both resolutions were accepted unanimously by the members.</p> <p>2. Resolution raised by Sdr. Jeswant Singh #1530: Proposed changes to the SNSM Constitution: #1 – The current Clause 15.1 in the SNSM constitution states that to call for EGM, whenever the Central Committee so decides or at the request of at least fifteen (15) members of the SNSM in such cases the purpose for which such meetings is called shall be considered dissolved</p> <p>He proposed that the present clause of the constitution be amended to – <i>"Shall be called whenever the Central Committee so decides or at the request of at least five (5) percents members in benefit of the SNSM as at date of previous AGM or the SNSM in such cases the purpose for which such meetings is called shall be considered dissolved"</i>.</p> <p>Vote was 62 out of 87 members in attendance (at the time the resolution was deliberated) were in favour of the proposal</p>

		<p>#2 – The current Clause 10.3 of the constitution states that the Jathedar (President) may be removed from office by a majority vote at an EGM, called for that purpose. In the event of his removal the committee shall automatically resign and a new Jathedar (President) will be elected.</p> <p>He proposed that the clause be amended to <i>"the Jathedar (President) may be removed from office by a majority two-thirds (2/3) vote at an EGM, called for that purpose. In the event of his removal the committee shall automatically resign and a new Jathedar (President) will be elected"</i>.</p> <p>Vote was a simple Majority of 55 out of 87 members (at the time the resolution was deliberated) supported the proposal.</p> <p>3. Sdr. Jeswant Singh #1530 raised a motion for the house to agree / approve. Motion: To get the agreement / approval of the house that "Proposal to stop discrimination in whatsoever manner against women"</p> <p>Vote was 82 out of 87 members at the time the resolution was deliberated) supported the Motion.</p> <p>Note: Full details of the proposed changes were made available to members as part of the AGM pack.</p>
9.	Elections of new Jathedar	<p>JatherdarJi officially announced the dissolution of the EXCO. And proposed Sdr Harbinder Singh #10059. to be appointed as the "Maukay Da Jathedar"</p> <p>Seconded by Sdr. Avtar Singh "Terry"</p> <p>Sdr. Harbinder Singh explained that in keeping with the long standing tradition of the Sikh Naujawan SNSM, the Meet Jathedar is the customary nomination. However, as legally required, he must be nominated in. Sdr. Harbinder then called for nominations for the position of Jathedar of the Sikh Naujawan SNSM.</p> <p>Nomination #1 – Sdr. Paramjeet Singh #0407 Proposed by Sdr. Sukhinderpal Singh #1801 Seconded by Sdr. Khushwant Singh #3241</p> <p>Nomination #2 – Sdr. Harjinder Singh #4904 Proposed by Sdr. Hardip Singh #10250 Seconded by Sdr. Daljit Singh #10303</p> <p>Nomination #3 – Sdr. Avtar Singh #2412 Proposed by Sdr. Jainank Singh #3545 Seconded by Sdr. Pavandeep Singh #4421</p> <p>Sdr. Manmohan Singh (Moni) #0047. proposed the nominations closed Seconded by Sdr. Gurdeep Singh #1188</p> <p>Dr Manjit Kaur #2690 requested that all 3 candidates be invited to speak for 2 minutes each on their plans for the SNSM.</p>

Bhenji Sarabjit Kaur #10274 suggested that all 3 candidates focus on the 3 areas when speaking

- a. what are your plans for making Sabha relevant in these times
- b. What will the EXCO mix look like (focus on age and gender equality)
- c. What are your plans for the communities outside KUL

Sdr. Avtar Singh

His main focus was going to building a reach out programme using social media directed at unifying the youth. His outreach will be aimed at the youth who have moved away and are no longer attracted to the philosophy of "religion"

He would also enhance our parchar activities – find out what is needed by going to the ground (nationwide) ensuring that the youth was connected to Gurbani.

Finally, he would like to unite the current divided groups so that the vision and mission of the SNSM can be achieved.

Sdr. Paramjeet Singh

Today we need to realise that SNSM existence will only be relevant if we empower the youth. Parameters have changed walls have come down the Naujawans themselves are doing an excellent job in their own places. His vision would be to tap into their energy and work together, he intends to listen to those with opposing ideas and build the bridges needed to create an environment of working together.

We don't need till a disaster strikes before we unite to work together. Our different ideologies and our different looks don't matter – the issues at hand are what matter. We are all equally responsible to address all the issues being faced by our youth.

The SNSM rose during the Covid 19 pandemic giving assistance without publicising any of their efforts – that is what Sikhi is all about and the EXCO should be judged on actual deeds.

He also stressed that the use of social media is very important in guiding and connecting and sharing our experiences and his main focus will be in bringing the SNSM to the current media age as that is the main stream where issues today are raised.

He asked that our members not be stumbling blocks but instead be building blocks – lets first start by doing a "Self-Check".

Sdr. Harjinder Singh

His 1st point of order would be to bring SikhInside back into the folds of the SNSM. He believes that any decisions made by his EXCO would be by seeking the clarification and advice of the Akaal Takht and not just by the members.


He assured that his EXCO would consist of members who would be 50 years and below and he would create different teams to tackle different issues.

He would establish departments such as

- Alert Department to take on issues like cutting hair in schools etc.
- Communications Department to communicate with gurdwaras to restart kirtan darbars / MGC / Niketan /SGS Academy to see how SNSM can jointly work together
- Branch Department which will be the liaison arm of the SNSM liaising with our branches i.e. Kedah / Penang / Ipoh

		<p>He would look at all the assets of SNSM and assures that within 6 months he will decide on what will happen with the Ipoh SNSM house and the hostel in Brickfields.</p> <p>Build a membership value scheme. Reach out to Sikh professionals and get them to give discounted services to SNSM members.</p> <p>He intends to reactivate the nationwide Kirtan Tours and for this he will approve the purchase of 2 new vans.</p> <p>The "Maukay Da Jathedar" requested that all 3 candidates take 5 minutes to discuss and come to an agreement on the outcome of how they would work together on ensuring that the "No Election" tradition of SNSM is maintained.</p> <p>However, since they were not able to reach an amicable decision, Sdr. Avtar Singh and Sdr. Paramjeet Singh graciously bowed out of the running in order to honour and value the Gursikhi tradition that was established by our 2 esteemed patrons namely Sant Baba Naranjan Singh and Sant Baba Sohan Singh and had thus far been upheld by our past Jathedars.</p> <p>Outgoing Jathedar Sdr Jasbir Singh handed over the Jathedarship to Incoming Jathedar Sdr. Harjinder Singh.</p> <p>Nominations and appointments of the 2 Internal Auditors was called for Nomination #1 – Sdr. Jaswant Singh #1530 Proposed by Sdr. Gurdeep Singh #1188 Seconded by Sdr. Satvinder Singh #287</p> <p>Nomination #2 – Sdr. Hardeep Singh #10203 Proposed by Sdr. Satvinder Singh #287 Seconded by Sdr. Gurmel Singh #2360</p> <p>As there were no other nominations and the house agreed, both nominees were unanimously appointed.</p>
10.	Other matters	<p>Sale of Titiwangsa SNSM House</p> <p>Sdr. Harbinder Singh informed the house that the outgoing EXCO had received an offer of RM5.6 million their decision was to give the mandate to the house to accept or reject the offer.</p> <p>The house approved the acceptance of the offer by a majority vote.</p> <p>The house also agreed and accepted the proposal put forward by the outgoing EXCO on the funds received from the sale of the Titiwangsa SNSM House.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - RM4 million be put aside for Khalsa land development - The remainder would be used to purchase a property in Bangsar as an appreciating fixed asset of the SNSM - Any remainder left over after the purchase to be used to renovate the SNSM Hostel located in Brickfields. <p>Sdr. Sukhdev Singh #600 questioned Sdr. Harbinder Singh on where the money for Human Development would come from and why no money had been allocated? To which Sdr. Harbinder Singh replied that as agreed and accepted by the house RM4 million would be set aside for Khalsa Land development and the incoming</p>

	<p>EXCO can then propose how the remainder of the funds will be utilised.</p> <p>Ipoh SNSM House Dr Sarabdeep Singh #5213 brought to the attention of the house that the Ipoh branch had received an offer of RM950,000.00 from a buyer to purchase the Ipoh SNSM House. He however, informed that as they had no other premise to move to, they were hesitant on selling the property.</p> <p>Sdr. Harbinder Singh advised that if we were receiving such a high offer, we should consider the offer very seriously. No more discussion on this took place.</p> <p>AGM was officially declared close @ 2:19pm</p>

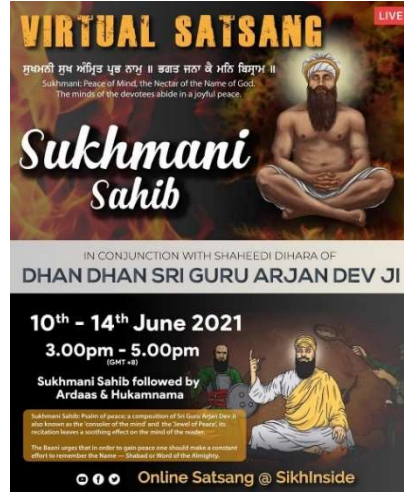
400th Parkash Purab of Dhan Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib Ji (Jan – May 2021)

Khalsa Land @ Kuala Kubu Baru

1. The main focus since the last report has been to obtain authorities approvals; calling of tenders & organizing fund raising efforts.
2. Phase 1 of the Project involves
 - a) TNB Sub Station -- completed
 - b) Accommodation Units (2 semi D units)
 - c) Multi purpose Hall
 - d) Elevated Water Tank
 - e) Guard House & Main Entrance
 - f) Roads & Drainage
 - g) Sewerage Treatment Plant (STP)
3. Phase 2 involves 2 Blocks of 4 storey hostels; 2 Blocks of 2 storey classrooms; Senior Citizens Village & 10 units of family chalets
4. The Building Plans for Phase 1 were submitted by Asima Architects to the Majlis Daerah's One Stop Centre (OSC) on the 17th March 2020. On the following day (18th March), nationwide MCO was enforced. The MCO brought matters to a standstill & everything was frozen.
5. As we faced funding constraints, it was decided to break up Phase 1 into 2 phases -- Phase 1A & Phase 1B. This required a change to the Layout Plan which was finally approved on 29th Sept 2020 with Building Plans approval on 12th May 2021. This approval is valid for 1 year until 11th May 2022.
6. To initiate the tender process, an " Invitation to Contractors" was published in the Asia Samachar on 18th May 2021. Four companies submitted their pre-qualification documents & all 4 were deemed to have met the pre-qualification criteria .

	<p>7. Eventually, 3 out of the 4 companies collected the tender documents, & 2 out of the 3 submitted their tenders. When the tenders were opened on 30th Nov 2021, both the tenders were found to be some 50% higher than our earlier estimates. This variance was attributed to the sharp rise in building material & labour costs when the economy started to normalize after the shutdowns experienced in 2020 & 2021.</p> <p>8. As the tender sums varied greatly than our earlier estimates, we decided both the tenders were not acceptable. Instead, we decided to review our specifications with a view to arriving at a more palatable figure. That is currently in progress.</p> <p>9. Meanwhile, fund raising efforts have been stepped up & we are now pressing ahead with a Daswandh Scheme & direct one to one fund raising efforts to raise the required funds of RM 2.9 M for Phase 1A before proceeding to Phase 1B. Delays in launching construction works will result in further rise in costs & it is important Phase 1A be undertaken soonest.</p> <p>10. With Waheguru's Grace, we are confident Gurdwaras & the Sangat will rise to the occasion & contribute generously to make this vision a reality.</p>

	<p>The Bhai Mardana Sangeet Festival (BMSF) went virtual in 2020! Following a stressful year plagued by the Coronavirus pandemic, it looked almost certain that BMSF 2020 would have to be cancelled, but with the advancements in technology, the enthusiastic response from our young local Kirtanis as well as the tireless efforts of the Sikhinside team, BMSF 2020 was held virtually over 4 days, streamed to the homes of thousands of Sikh families all over the world. The main objective of the Bhai Mardana Sangeet Festival has always been to first and foremost, provide a platform to young local and regional Kirtanis to showcase their talent whilst also giving them an opportunity to do Kirtan on a grand stage. The same objectives were maintained this time, and thanks to its virtual nature there was participation from more than 100 young and senior Kirtanis from all over the world. There were Kirtanis that participated from 9 different countries, which include Malaysia, Singapore, Indonesia, India, Australia, UK, USA, Italy and New Zealand.</p> <p>The planning and preparations for BMSF 2020 started a little over 6 weeks before the broadcast dates, with members of the team taking up different responsibilities, from contacting the Kirtanis, to preparing content, to logistics planning as well as marketing duties. This year's BMSF featured two additional segments – firstly was the sharing sessions</p>

	<p>conducted by knowledgeable community speakers like Veer Jasbir of Singapore, Bhai Sukha Singh from UK, Veer Kirit Singh of Dhruvpadhamar, Phenji Jasleen Kaur of SikhRi as well as our own Penji Gurprit Kaur of Basics of Sikhi, Asia. Topics covered and shared ranged from Guru Nanak’s life events, to important messages from Guru Nanak’s Bani, as well as a deeper insight on Gurmat Sangeet and its origins. This new introduction was received well by members of the Sanggat, who along with enjoying soulful Kirtan got to brush up some of their Sikhi knowledge as well.</p> <p>The second new addition to BMSF 2020 was the “Cha teh Charcha” sessions, which was anchored by our very own organising team member, Veer Kulbeer Singh. These sessions included quizzes on the sharing sessions, interviews of prominent Gurmat Sangeet promoters in Malaysia, as well as a special dedication to the Sikh frontliners dealing with the Covid-19 pandemic in Malaysia. This new addition was introduced to bring a variety to the broadcast, and was aired every hourly throughout the weekend. With 15 volunteers, over 40 hours of recording resulting in 4 days of blissful Kirtan, viewed by more than 10,000 viewers daily, BMSF 2020 went on smoothly, with the grace and blessings of the Sanggat.</p>

6.3.2	<p>Objectives, Aim and Outline</p> <p>Objective of Samelan: To bring children, youths and Sewadars together to experience Gurmat learning while networking among each other and building lasting friendships through fun and interactive Sewa and other activities. Despite pandemic restrictions, it was still decided that we should carry on with a virtual Samelan so that participants and Sewadars could partake in this annual event that is always looked forward to safely from their own homes.</p> <p>Daily e-Samelan Schedule included many interactive sessions such as Connect via Simran, Family Japji Sahib, Message from Guru Ji, Masala Bytes, Salutation to Khalsa, Daily Downloads, Level Up, Unleash the Gamers and Be Inspired. Many of these sessions were shared with open access to the online Sanggat so families could enjoy connecting to Naam together and ensure an experience of maximum participation and engagement in youth inspired sessions.</p> <p>A total of 590 delegates registered for the e-Samelan, out of which 91 were Nikey Khalsay, 197 Mighty Khalsay, 110 Miri Piris and 156 Sewadars. Only 36 Walk in participants were received. To be noted that the late comer registration system did not register their ages hence roughly equal numbers of delegates were categorized in Sewadars, Nikkey Khalsay, Mighty Khalsay and Miri Piris. Registration team was led by Ajitpal Singh, Ravinderjit Singh and Harwinder Singh.</p>

6.3.3	<p>Marketing & Promotions</p> <p>Various engaging and creative poster and video designs were shared on Sikhinside social media to promote and spread awareness on the occurrence of a first ever virtual E-Samelan. Marketing initiatives were led by Amanjyot Singh.</p>
6.3.4	<p>Location, Logistics & Operations</p> <p>The first ever annual E-Samelan was conducted using a base in Sentul Gurdwara from 23rd - 27th Dec 2020 with Navjeet Singh as the chairperson. One studio was set up with a digital screen, 1 mini Darbar Sahib and 1 classroom were set up for recording / live stream of sessions. All nighttime IPS sessions were streamed live in the studio whereas morning Nitnem & IPS sessions were recorded in the mini Darbar Sahib. Management of all streaming and recording of sessions and the overall execution of the first ever virtual Samelan were conducted by Sikhinside. Without their assistance, such a Sewa could not have been successfully accomplished.</p>
6.3.5	<p>Miri Piri</p> <p>Coordination of Miri Piri Program was done by Jagmeet Singh and Arwin Singh. Specifically, Arwin Singh and Palwinder Singh planned the program flow of the Learning modules whereas Jagmeet Singh and Gurpreet Singh managed Jatha Coordinators for each Jatha. Virtual execution of all Miri Piri programs were lead by Ajit Singh and Ajeet Singh.</p> <p>A special event, the Model Sikh Youth Sabha coordinated by Jagdeep Singh was conducted from the 25th to 27th of December, 2020 with active participation by our talented and outspoken Miri Piri delegates that signed up for the competition via submission of a video answering selected questions. A special opening address for the event was conducted by YB Ramkarpal Singh (MP of Malaysia) and Gurrattan Singh (MPP of Ontario, Canada). All delegates were asked to vote on topics they would wish to debate upon and asked to prepare a speech script in advance prior to live sitting. Independent judges were consulted to panel debate sessions wherein points were awarded for written speech content, ideas proposed, verbal presentation skills, ideas proposed and rebuttal skills. Daily winners were selected with giveaway of cash prizes. This event was opened to 50 delegates aged 15-35 years with 3 debate motions that were streamed online via Sikhinside social media for Sangats' viewing.</p> <p>To continue the spirit of Sewa that is very much focused upon in physical Samelans, Miri Piri participants were also requested to incorporate Sewa into their household chores and had fun being involved in an online Scavenger Hunt. The age groups involved in this category were 13 to 20 years old.</p>
6.3.6	<p>Mighty Khalsa</p> <p>The Mighties team was developed and coordinated with online participation of Sewadars from various locations both within Malaysia and overseas, whereby Lead Coordinator was Ravinder Kaur, assisted by Ashwinder Kaur. Virtual execution of all Mighties Khalsa programs were led by Prethpal Singh.</p> <p>Among important points that were elaborated upon in Gyan Ka Sagar and Group Dynamic</p>

	<p>classroom sessions were Sakhis to help participants familiarize with Guru Angad Dev Ji's Sikhia, introduction to Gurmukhi alphabets and relating them to positive traits found in participants, awareness on importance of mental and physical health and preparation of or management of Langgar expenses. This group range consisted of participants ranging from 7 to 12 years of age.</p>
6.3.7	<p>Nikkey Khalsa The Nikkey Khalsay was coordinated by Arwin Singh and Amrita Kaur. 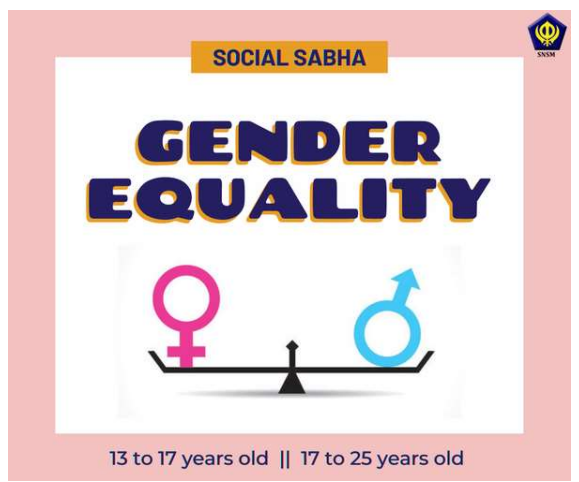

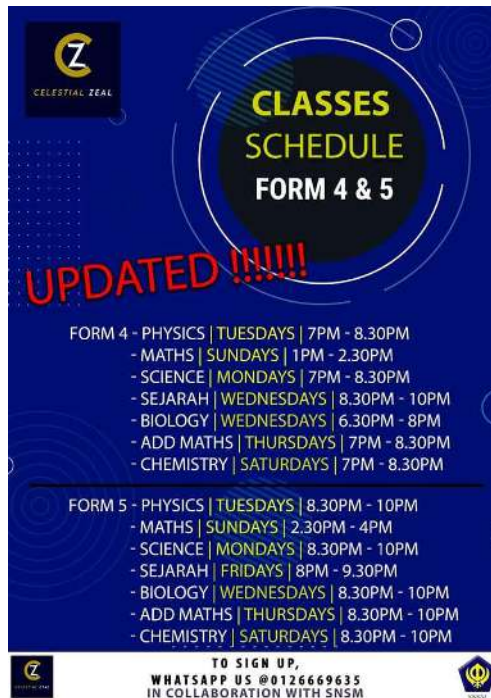
6.8	Social Sabha
	<p>Social Sabha</p> <p>Social Sabha was an idea which was set up as an unofficial extension from e-Samelan 2020. Seeing as everything was going virtual, it was only natural to have an online space for the youth of Malaysia. A safe platform in which they are able to express freely and hold discussions on topics that are otherwise labeled as taboo.</p> <p>Social Sabha occurs monthly and has been up and running since January 2021! Youths have been divided into two groups (Young Teenagers (13-17 years old) and Young Adults (18-25 years old)) to ensure more targeted discussions can take place. The sessions are held virtually over Zoom and moderated by our Sewadars.</p> <p>For the first 3 months, Social Sabha has facilitated important deliberations over topics such as Social Media Awareness, Relevance of Sikh Organisations and most recently Gender Equality. The discussions have been brilliant and compelling to say the least! Engagement from participants and the sheer intensity has left the Sewadars mind blown!</p> <p>One intriguing topic, currently in the pipeline is Mental Health. To ensure a certain degree of accountability and professionalism, this session will be led by Qualified Professionals.</p> <p>In June 2021, SNSM collaborated with Sikh Research Institute (SikhRi) to organise a Social Sabha discussion on the 1984 Sikh Genocide.</p> <p>In times like today, where the world has been engulfed by a pandemic, it is more crucial than ever to stick together. Tough times don't last, but tough people do. As a responsible youth-based organisation, it was only natural for SNSM to ensure the Sikh youths have an outlet to get their voices heard, encourage healthy discussion and make sure there is a support system available. This also provides SNSM with an opportunity to learn from and connect with the youths, sticking true to the principle of lifelong learning.</p> <p>Moving forward, SNSM aims to further solidify Social Sabha as a readily available virtual platform, as it ensures our organization does not shy away from important discussions. 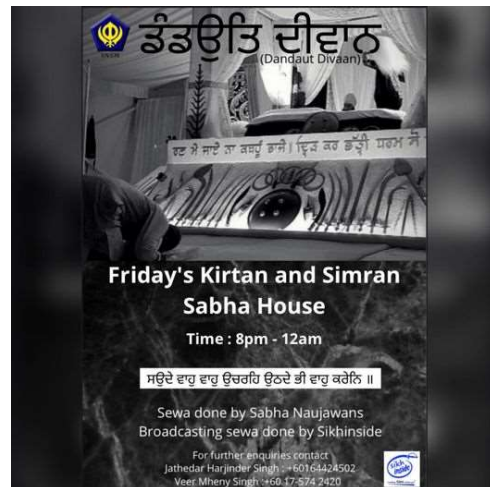
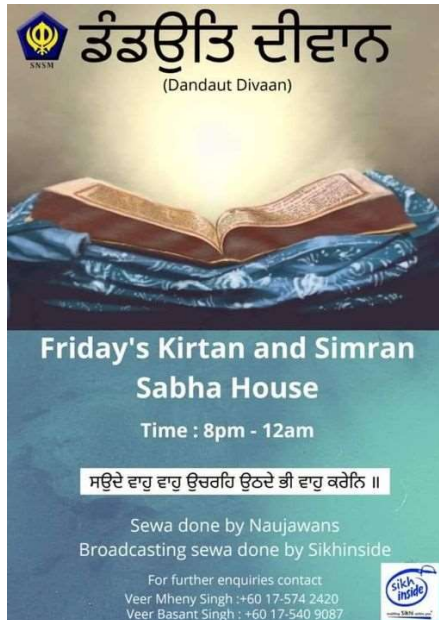

As per Agenda item 55.7: Other matters furthering the objectives of the Sabha, I would like to bring this matter to the attention of members to be deliberated. This matter, if not addressed can bring about consequences which can set wrong precedence.

Topic: Marriage performed at the beach in Penang which transgresses the hukamnama issued by Akaal Takhat relating to prohibition of marriages conducted at marriage palaces or hotels.

A marriage ceremony was conducted by Jathedar Harjinder Singh at a beach in December 2021. Upon receiving many queries, the past Jathedars decided to convene a meeting with Jathedar Harjinder Singh, as the name of Sikh Naujawan Sabha Malaysia was being dragged into this controversy. The meeting was convened in Sabha House on 12/12/2021 at 10.00am and was attended by past Jathedars Vir Amarjit Singh, Vir Malkith Singh, Vir Pavandeep Singh and Vir Jasbir Singh. The remaining past Jathedars in Malaysia namely Master Daljit Singh, Vir Autar Singh, Vir Harwinder Singh, Vir Harbinder Singh, Sardar Harcharan Singh and Vir Sukhdev Singh were unable to attend but supported the move to meet Jathedar Harjinder Singh.

Meeting concluded with Jathedar Harjinder Singh agreeing to write a letter on an individual capacity mentioning:

1. He observed all the protocols in bringing Sri Guru Granth Sahib ji to the grounds.
2. Upon advise of the past Jathedars, he had transgressed the Hukamnama issued by Akaal Takhat (AT) in 1998
3. He apologizes for this and will ensure nothing of this will happen in future.

He agreed to publish this letter in a day or two.

The past Jathedars also advised him that

1. He is seen as a Jathedar of SNSM and is to lead and advise the youth on the tenets of Sikhi as per AT, Sikh Rehat Maryada and teachings of SGGS ji.
2. Marriage is an important part of a Sikh and the intention of doing parkash of SGGS ji is spiritual and not a show or a mere standard practise.

However, Jathedar Harjinder Singh did not proceed to publish the letter even after a friendly reminder was sent on 13 December 2021. I would like to find out the reasons why Jathedar ji did not proceed to publish the letter. The past Jathedars saw this as important to let everyone know the seriousness of the marriage institution and gurdwaras as a focal point for such ceremonies to be convened. If we do not take it seriously, the tenets, teachings and maryada will not be taken heed of. Sikh Naujawan Sabha Malaysia is duty bound

to spread the teachings to the Sikh Youth in Malaysia and we are seen as exemplary to ensure the masses understand why such ceremonies are of utmost importance to us.
